BARTENDER CHALLENGE



Assistance Summary November 2019-April 2020




Since our last newsletter, we have helped people in 21 Wyoming communities that affected over 100 family members. These funds have gone directly to infants, youths, adults and elderly clients who are experiencing temporary or ongoing needs.

Our office receives referrals from dozens of Hospitals, doctors, advocacy organizations, social workers, and more across eight states seeking assistance for Wyoming residents.



In the last six months assistance has been provided to clients with a range of different diagnoses, including Multiple Sclerosis, issues with pain such as fibromyalgia, crushed discs, and osteoporosis, and many different kinds of cancers. All clients are required to have a professional referral and to demonstrate need to be eligible for funds within our programs.

Wyoming CARES provides medical and non-medical funding assistance to individuals. Since November 2019, assistance has been provided for home modifications such as ramps and accessible bathrooms, for medically necessary travel, support services, and more.

From the President of the Board of Directors

The COVID-19 crisis has affected everyone, and of course this includes us at Wyoming CARES. The spring is traditionally our biggest fundraising season, and we hold about a half-dozen events across the state that we have had to postpone, reschedule, ro cancel due to our concerns over safety as well as government restrictions. Despite these unprecedented challenges, we have pushed forward in continuing to support our mission, to assist Wyoming residents in need. I would like to thank the volunteer members Board of Directors, of the Professional Review Committee, and the Bike Tour committee for continuing to volunteer and work through these unprecedented times.

I would also like to thank the businesses, foundations like the McMurry Foundation, the Wyoming Breast Cancer Initiative, the Wyoming Community Foundation, and the Hughes Charitable Foundation who have provided us with grants and support. Of course I would also like to thank our donors and staff, who have helped keep us on track.

Since our inception in 2001, Wyoming CARES has helped 2317 residents of Wyoming, affecting 5262 family members in 94 communities all across our wonderful state. We do not receive any national, governmental, or United Way affiliations, and we are not financed by any huge out-of-state systems or foundations. Quite simply, Wyoming CARES is wyoming folks helping each other in times of need.

The COVID-19 crisis hasn't changed what our mission is or what kind of help we provide. Wyoming CARES has **never** turned away anyone for lack of funds, and we hope to continue that record. It is an unfortunate truth that as times get hard, more people need help, and so I would like to use this section to make a direct appeal to our readers, donors, and event participants. While we continue to adapt to the new normal, cut costs and seek new and creative ways to raise money, I and everyone at Wyoming CARES are hoping that if you are looking for ways to make a difference, you consider donating to Wyoming CARES.
